



Intercultural competence: work more successfully with international & home students

Are you in an institution that is growing in terms of the diversity in cultures of its' student and staff due to the internationalisation of Higher Education? How can these changes benefit your personal and professional growth and your interactions with students and colleagues? And how can you develop the knowledge, skills and attitudes that make up the intercultural competencies that can help you to develop your ability to get along with, learn from and work more successfully with people from diverse cultures?

This two-day workshop will examine the nature of cultures and how they impact on individuals and educational contexts. The notion of 'cultures' is explored using several different cultural frameworks: Intersectionality, Cultural Continuums and Multicollectivity. The course aims to raise participants' awareness of how cultures such as age, gender, ethnicity and education shape their personal behaviour, values systems, belief and attitudes and how this will impact on the way they see and interact with students and colleagues from different cultures.

The workshop then goes on to examine the expectations home and international students and colleagues bring with them and how they can lead to both positive outcomes and miscommunications and how to use these situations and turn them into positives. The aim is to build individuals and communities that become increasingly global and thus producestudents and academics who are more global in outlook and more able to take thisviewpoint out into the international world of work and education.
